

Promote female child birth rate

In India the population of girls has been decreasing. We need to understand that girls are our fortune. Socio-economic empowerment of women is essential for making informed decisions and for change of the mind sets. A healthy male-female ratio is a social need. While female foeticide is bad in itself, the fact that millions of girls are "missing" in India has profound human and social implications. A stronger law to deal with those resorting to sex-selective abortions needs to be enacted.

The reasons for high number of incidence of female foeticide in India include a deep rooted traditional son preference, continued practice of dowry and concern for safety of the girl child and exploitation and abuse of women and girl children. In order to curb female foeticide and improve the sex ratio, a strong multi-pronged strategy that includes legislative measures, advocacy, awareness generation and programmes for socio-economic empowerment of women is needed. According to a study in India by an Indo-Canadian team of researchers, about 5,00,000 female foetuses have been aborted annually. This estimate appears to be closer to the truth. Atrocities against women are on the rise, and female foeticide is one of the most brutal of them all. Despite a slew of laws to prevent female foeticide and schemes to encourage families to have girl child, the ratio is declining. Female foeticide is a shocking practice that has grown in the last few decades. Although the media and the government have made attempts to highlight the negative impact of pre-natal sex identification and selective

abortion, the practice continues as reflected in the declining sex ratio.

There's a huge deficit of women because families fear the cost of raising a daughter. It is a commonly practiced tradition (despite being outlawed) that the bride's family pays a large sum of money to the groom's family at the wedding. Plus, women are generally not seen as bread-winners and or allowed to inherit wealth like men in some states. Sex-selection is now spreading to rural areas as the technology gets cheaper and enforcement of the law remains ineffectual. The imbalance in sex ratio may increase violence, including rape, against women. With many men remaining unmarried, prostitution will increase substantially. Media exposes of doctors providing sex-selection services and offering to abort girls are commonplace, but they have little overall impact because demand is too strong. Doctors and radiologists conducting, or soliciting parents for, sex determination tests can be imprisoned up to five years and fined up to Rs.50,000. Despite the PC & PNDT Act, the conviction rate is low and the selection of male child before conception and female foeticide continue to take place. Despite rising levels of education, gender awareness and stringent pro-women laws, change has been slow and violence against women is increasing. Visionary leadership, stringent implementation of laws and a united effort to discourage dowry are the need of the hour. Educational programmes encouraging parents to view daughters as no less valuable than sons need to be mounted. Be careful if you receive a message about RTO fines or gas bills

Ahmedabad, If you receive a message from RTO challan, gas bill, mobile provider on your mobile phone, open it with caution. If you open any message, your bank account can be wiped out. In Gujarat, incidents of cyber fraud have increased by sending such messages and controlling SMS. The police have also now asked people to be alert about this. Bhaskar had a conversation with cyber experts and officials related to cyber crime about how these incidents are happening and what people should be careful about to avoid them. People who have been victims of such messages also told their stories to Bhaskar.

87 complaints registered on 1930 helpline. With the increase in incidents of fraud by sending messages in Gujarat, the cyber cell is collecting data on such incidents happening in the state. Ahmedabad Cyber Crime Officer Dharmendra Sharma told Bhaskar that so far, approximately 87 complaints have been registered. Most of which are complaints received on 1930. In which the figure of fraud committed has come to light to be more than one crore. How does fraud happen? It is being revealed that people's money is being lost due to many modus operandi of cyber crime. In which a message is sent from the RTO or from the mobile service provider that the person has made some mistake and a warning is given that the phone will be switched off.

After reading this, the mobile holder clicks on the message and immediately the APK file is downloaded in the background on the mobile. Gradually, access to your phone goes to the other person in two ways. What is an APK file and what are its dangers? APK (Android Package Kit) is the format of Android applications. Apps downloaded from trusted platforms like Google Play Store or Apple Store are safe because they are scanned for security. But such unknown APK files are full of malware (viruses). By downloading and installing this file, criminals get complete access to your phone. This app steals your contacts, messages, gallery, banking app passwords, OTP and other

personal information. This can empty your bank account or misuse your photos, videos or documents to blackmail you. People from small villages to big cities have become victims. Gujarat Cyber Crime is currently advising people not to open unknown SMS and download any links. Because what has happened in Gujarat in the last one week is very shocking. Be it a small village or a big city, everyone is currently afraid of phishing attacks and the statistics that have come to light in this regard are very shocking. From cities like Ahmedabad, Vadodara, Surat, Rajkot to small villages, people have also faced phishing attacks and an amount of more than one crore rupees has disappeared. Different agencies are working

in this regard. Ahmedabad Cyber Crime ACP Hardik Makadia told Divya Bhaskar that usually when you press this message, the APK file gets downloaded in the background and in which they take control of your SMS due to which you get to know about the financial transaction late. Generally, you should stay away from such messages or links. Currently, messages from RTO and mobile operators are coming and in this regard, the process of registering a complaint in Cyber Crime has also been initiated. DCP Lavina Sinha of Ahmedabad Cyber Crime Branch told Divya Bhaskar that currently many messages of RTO memos are coming in, in this regard we have also initiated the process of registering a complaint.
